# Season 1 of 4NCL Online

Coronavirus may have stopped the physical chess club from meeting but the move it has not stopped the chess world. The move to online chess seems to have been taken up by many chess clubs and players. Given that, the national league organised its first online competition and received over 130 entries. They were expecting somewhere in the region of 30. The chess world certainly has kept spinning during all this.



The final round of the 4NCL online has sadly come and gone. As team captain, it has been an absolute pleasure to play competitive chess with my friends. Rugeley chess club has faced some tough teams throughout this season. The list of whom are below:

Round 1 – Hatch End B

A new team to online chess just like us, Rugeley were victorious over this team 3½-½.

Round 2 – Manchester Juniors B

Manchester Juniors are a regular in junior 4NCL and have an experienced coach to back them. This team finished above us in the league but we held them to a 2 - 2 draw.

Round 3 – Bristol University B

Our first loss of the season and this one stung a little bit. They had so many experienced players, I remember Luke got an ex England Junior. I thought they would finish higher in the league, this was a tough team and many thanks to them for the game. This is the one match I have not yet done a report on. Round 4 – Bishop Knights

Round 5 – Broken Herts 1

A team from Hertfordshire and new to the league just like us. This match was close but Rugeley managed to edge out the win 2% - 1%

## Round 6 – Temple Sutton

This one was a new one like us and we had been close to the same number of points all the way through up until this point. The grades were so close when we played each other also, I was not surprised to see us draw this match 2 - 2.

## Round 7 – Kent KJCA Kestrels D

This is a very experienced team playing J4NCL, 4NCL main and J4NCL online. It was fun for me to play against a team I've arbited so much throughout the years and seen their players grow so strong. They also threw us a curveball altering their team more than I expected and strengthened it against us. After a rocky start, we drew this match 2 - 2.

#### Round 8 – Chess Warriors

Another strong junior team. While they may not play in the same teams in 4NCL they do play and these juniors I've seen at a lot of the top competitions. They ran us close but Rugeley edged them out  $2\frac{1}{2}$  -  $1\frac{1}{2}$ 

## Round 9 - Hertford

This was the strongest team in the league. We cannot get much higher than this lot. When we played them, they were in position 3 and they definitely took us seriously. They have two players rated just under 2200 playing for them. This was the first both played together at the same time. I expected trouble as when you get to the end I've seen 4NCL teams really strengthen their side. It was a tough fight and I know I was winning at one point (shocking I know). This one we lost 1-3 but it's good to know that it took the strongest team in the league to give us a loss after 5 weeks.

## Round 10 – Bolton & Worsley

This is a main 4NCL team and their players are well known to visit congresses all over the UK. This was a tough fight, but sadly we could only get two draws and they handed us two losses leaving us with 1 - 3.

Of all these teams we played, four of them finished above us in the table. Hertford, Temple Sutton, Kent KJCA Kestrels and Bolton & Worsley.

We have had positive comments from several teams. Hertford were extremely impressed with our website and our team itself and wanted to challenge us again sometime.

A friend of mine in Scotland paid attention to some of our games (given he's the 4NCL guy entering the teams into the anti-cheating software) and really hoped his team would play ours. Steve took the full brunt of our opponent's assault. On board 1 he faced the strongest opposition. A common theme for these games are that the opponent's strength was higher than their rating would indicate. Steve managed 1 win, 6 draws and 3 losses.

Matt – There are a few of these games that could have gone either way. Trouble is they more often than not went to the opponents when he tried to be aggressive. With an average opponent rating of 1642 being close to his own rating, 4 wins, 1 draw and 5 losses seems accurate.

Luke also faced a similar opposition to his rating of 1585. The average ratings of his opponent were 1521. 4 wins, 2 draws and 4 losses and considering one of those draws was against a player whose ECF is 135. Luke has put in some great work. Ryan's grade that's converted for use in this competition is 1322 and the average strength of his opponents was 1367. These opponents are stronger than their rating without a doubt and without a doubt he performed above his rating. 7 wins, 0 draws and 3 losses.
